

HISTORY IN BRIEF



The University of Peradeniya is the heir to a sixty year old University tradition which commenced with the inception of the University of Ceylon, the first institution of its kind established in Colombo on 1st July 1942. It moved to the banks of Mahaweli River, the longest in the Country, in 1952. However the history of its evolution as the oldest and the largest University in the country pass through the following stages.

1942 to 1952 - University of Ceylon

1952 to 1972 - University of Ceylon Peradeniya

1972 to 1978 - Peradeniya Campus, University of Sri Lanka

Since 1978 - University of Peradeniya

Sir Ivor Jennings the first Vice-Chancellor, on his first visit to the campus site in 1944 with the site plan of the architect Sir Patrick Abercrombie's, has written,

"No University in the world would have such a setting".

The convocation for the first batch of graduates took place November 21st 1952. The postponed official opening of the university took place in presence of Queen Elizabeth on April 20th 1954.

The University is located in Peradeniya in the Central Province, which bares lush greenery vegetation and mist-clad mountains, approximately 6 km from the City of Kandy, the historic Capital of the last independent Kingdom and 110 km from Colombo, Capital of Sri Lanka, and can be reached within two to three hours by public road or by railway.

The access to the University premises is through Galaha Road from the turn off near the historic Royal Botanical Gardens of Peradeniya, a popular tourist and lovers' attraction, famous for its rare tropical plants and orchids.

The University covers about 700 hectares of land and the developed area covering approximately 130 hectares that is occupied by buildings of the Faculties, Halls of Residence, Staff bungalows etc.

Throughout the campus, most trees begin to bear flowers in early March signaling the coming of spring. Lovers' Lane, Kissing Bend, open-air theater and the



lower Hantana Road display a rare aesthetic beauty through the rich foliage.

By present, University of Peradeniya has evolved into an educational giant comprising of 9 faculties, 4 postgraduate institutions, 15 centers, 84 departments with distant education programs, an extensive library network, sports and recreational and residential facilities. It teaches around 12,000 students in a year in the fields of Medicine, Agriculture, Art, Science, Engineering, Dental Sciences, Veterinary Medicine and Animal Science, management and Allied Health Science. It is declared to have the largest government endowment by a higher education institute in Sri Lanka and has consecutively won number one among University rankings of the country.

A group of Researchers from Stanford University, USA has published an analysis using citations from Scopus, assessing scientists for career long citation impact up until the end of 2020 and for citation impact during the single calendar year 2020.

Updated databases and code are freely available via https://elsevier.digitalcommonsdata.com/datasets/btchxktzyw/3. This version is based on the Aug 01, 2021 snapshot from Scopus and is updated to citation year 2020.

The selection is based on the top 100,000 by c-score (with and without self-citations) or a percentile rank of 2% or above.

In the database published on 19 Oct 2021, the scientists given in Table 1 and 2 from the University of Peradeniya are listed. The rank is based on the composite score calculated using h index, hm index, total citations, total cites to single authored papers, total cites to single and first authored papers, and total cites to single plus first plus last authored papers.
